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Equine Facilitated Learning





This term we have been very fortunate to be able to introduce Equine Facilitated Learning to all of our pupils at our Leybourne School. The EFL course comprises of 5 sequenced lessons: building a relationship with the horses, working alongside them to complete obstacles from the ground, and learning the non-verbal



communications to gain an understanding of equine behaviour. Thirteen Leybourne students have completed the course so far, building excellent positive relationships with the horses, building their confidence and developing communication skills. From September we will be introducing the course to our Canterbury students and have enrolled ten students so far.
